Only fitting one might say of N.Z.'s leading yachting magazine (see Crossword clue 1 across).

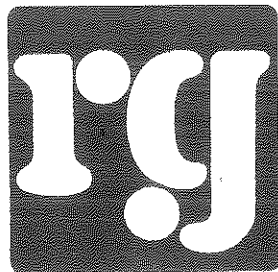

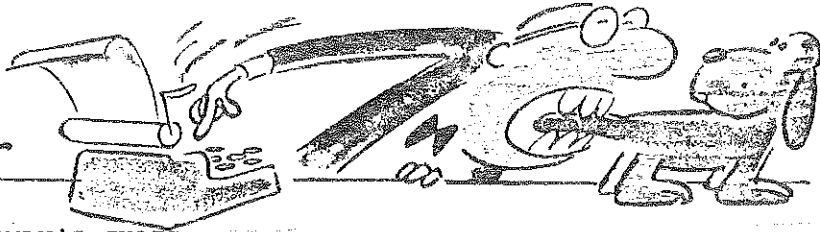

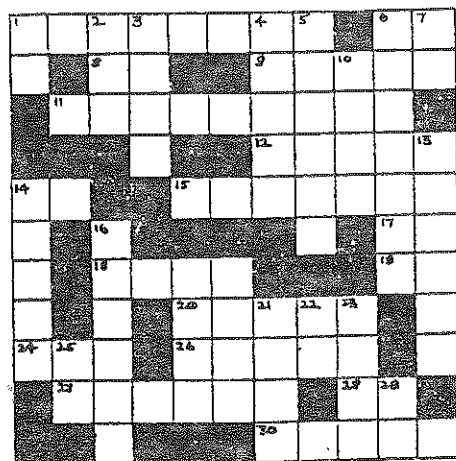

Thanks for the copy of "WEST WIND" and I would compliment you on the presentation, content and printing.

As publicity bod for the Mt Pleasant Yacht Club it puts my roneo jobs to shame.

I would seriously suggest you go a stage further and collect all the previous snippets of Zephyr information together with perhaps chapters on various sailing conditions by skippers who excel in (A) 80 knots, (B) 12 knots, (C) light air. Stick this lot in a book and charge quite highly for it - it would sell quite well!

You may recall my "Karyn" who came from Waiuku. She now has the wood brown acrylic paint removed (!) and is in good Zephyr trim with off white hull and varnish top, much midnight oil...

I can also give a very concise account of how to sail a zephyr under option A above and it is best done in the local tavern. - Zephuros.)



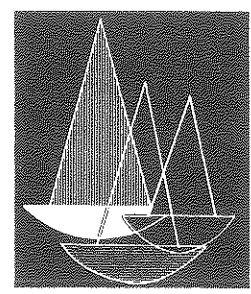

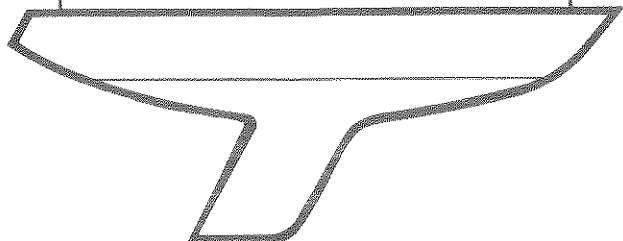
