### CLUB ACCESS CODE

Naval Point Club Lyttelton's parking/rigging area is secured by a barrier arm. A code for our regatta has been made. The code is in **your emailed version of this booklet** – please **have this ready** when you drive up to the club to avoid delays.

When leaving, just drive through as the barrier is weight activated and will open automatically.

### OFFICE AND PEOPLE

The club office is downstairs through a sliding door in the building. The designated persons ashore (Jo Jones and Bruce) will be cruising round here normally, Bruce will be in a NPCL shirt, and will be able to answer most questions you have. Amanda Norris will be around in the NPCL office too.

### BAR AND CLUBHOUSE

Bar and Wardroom are upstairs. We'll be holding the briefing in here, along with daily prizegivings, food, results, etc. Please remember the bar is now cashless.

### AMENITIES

Toilets and changing rooms are through the bar and down the stairs past the fire door. There are men's and women's facilities, and showers available as well. There is an access directly down the side of the building.

## PARKING AND BOAT STORAGE

We share the area with the Waka and the Jet Junkies, and we ask that a front row of parking is available for trailer parking for NPCL members.

There will be limited parking in our area, though there is plenty of public parking further down the road in the newly finished public area. In the past, we have been able to store peoples road trailers in our haulout yard - we just push them into an available corner. Happy to do this again but it is at owners' risk.

**Security** – boat storage is at your own risk. Zephyrs will be on the grass next to our shipping containers, and rescue boats in the sheds, on the hard or in the carpark. There are freedom campers across the road from our yard. Any issue please make our staff aware.

## LYTTELTON VILLAGE GUIDE

### SATURDAY MARKET

A market is normally run down London Street on Saturday, they sell all sorts of food and wares which can be worth a look. Parking gets pretty tricky though, but it's a 20 min walk from the club. It's pretty popular - so expect that.

### FOOD AND COFFEE

Head up to London Street for some excellent coffee – supporters on shore may even be able to see the racing from the balcony at Lyttelton Coffee Company. Lyttelton Bakery on Norwich Quay is worth a visit for a decent pie and a sandwich or an extravagant treat, and the local fish and chip shop is up on London Street along with sushi, and Arbour Pizza is just around the corner on Oxford Street.

If you're keen for a proper restaurant style meal – shoot into the Fisherman's Wharf by the tunnel entrance, Eruption Brewing on London Street, or Super, an Asian-Fusion restaurant, down by the port.

There is a Supervalu supermarket on London Street - parking is off Canterbury Street, and you walk up a set of steps to get in there. Access to Wunderbar is also from this carpark.

## BARS

Of course our bar at Naval Point Club Lyttelton is mint, supporting local brewers like Eruption and Cassels. We also offer an excellent range of pizza, hot chips, wedges, and a variety of options for cheese boards. Please note the NPCL bar is cashless as of 2024, so bring your card.

But if we are closed you do have other options. There are several good bars along the London Street that are worth visiting, and they all do a pretty good feed. Eruption Brewing is the local brewery, and you'll find it on tap at NPCL as well. Highly recommend a visit.

## TRANSPORT IF YOU ARE DRINKING

If you're drinking, the cheapest option is the Uber app— around \$30 to get you through the tunnel.

## FUEL

There are no petrol facilities in Lyttelton. If you need petrol, the best place to use is the NPD on Port Hills road before the Lyttelton Tunnel. There is also a BP in Redcliffs Village for anyone driving over the hill from Sumner.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

### First Aid

The First Aid kit is located in the NPCL main office area behind the sliding doors. It's sitting to the left and NPCL invite you to make use of it. If you need help, please see the NPCL Shore Manager Bruce wearing a NPCL blue polo.

### AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

A defibrillator is located on the wall to the left of the blue double doors. The code for the locker are on the emergency contact in the window of the volunteer office besides the NPCL main desk. The AED gives you step-by-step voice instructions on how to use the defibrillator in the event of a cardiac emergency.

### Fire

Evacuate the clubhouse and assemble in the carpark. No smoking anywhere around the clubrooms and rescue boat sheds.

### Tsunami

Evacuate up the hill using the track behind the NPCL club room.

### Earthquake

If in the club, please evacuate out the club front door and not the toilet door, meeting in the car park.

And finally, Sailors need to attend the briefings. You will be told about reef and the shipping lane. Make sure you sign on and off. Sail within your limits.

## FREE BUMP CAPS THANKS TO C-TECH

Not all incidents on the water can be avoided, or are within a sailor's control. The topic of head protection has been raised a few times in our fleet since the 2023 Nationals, with us seeing some examples of helmets making a difference - and some concussions that could have been helped by the use of head protection.



Helmets are fantastic and encouraged, but we know a helmet isn't everyone's thing, which raised the question "how do we normalise ongoing use of head protection across the Zephyr fleet?" – the answer? Give another, comfortable, lighter, great-looking option to the whole fleet at our Nationals in Lyttelton!

**Thanks to the generous support of C-TECH, we are very excited to be able to provide bump caps to all competitors this season.**

**We highly encourage their use during the regatta** (plus in your future sailing). They're great to avoid bumps from temperamental booms when rigging too.

Options of a short or longer brim are available, so make sure you get to registration early to get your preference! Lanyard cords included – please tie to your lifejackets.

Notes: The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SSI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule in the SSI means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

#### RULES

- 1 a. [NP] [DP] Canterbury Regional Harbour By-laws apply.  
<https://www.ecan.govt.nz/document/download?uri=2473039>. Boats must keep clear of working vessels in the main navigational channel. Boats that infringe this by-law shall be liable to disqualification after protest by the race committee. In accordance with RRS42.3(i), boats are permitted to motor or paddle directly out of the main navigation channel, as marked in Lyttelton Harbour, to comply with the Canterbury Regional Authority Navigation Safety By-law.
- b. Appendix T (Arbitration) (*page 150 RRS 2021-2024*) will apply.

#### CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SI 3)

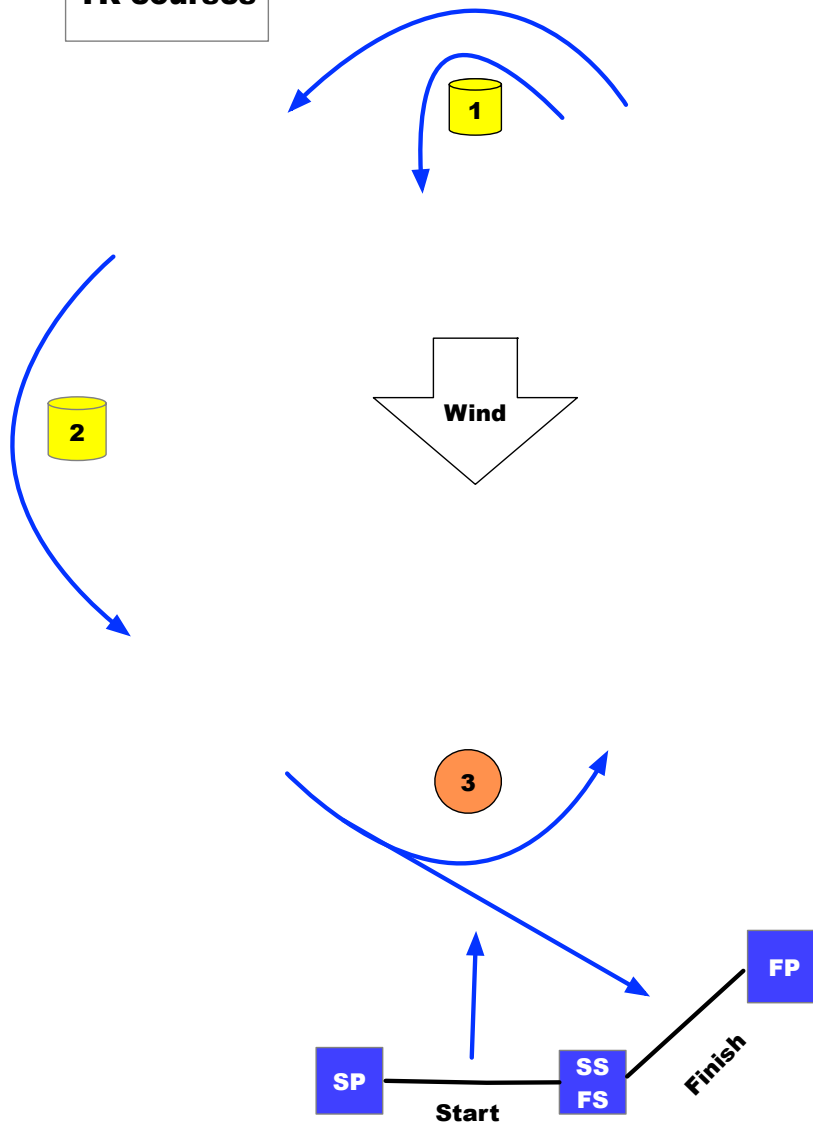

#### SIGNALS MADE ASHORE (SI 4)

4. Signals ashore will be displayed on the flagstaff located immediately to the east of the clubhouse
5. A boat shall not leave the shore until flag D is displayed. The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag D is displayed or not before the scheduled time, whichever is the later.
6. When flag AP is displayed ashore '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

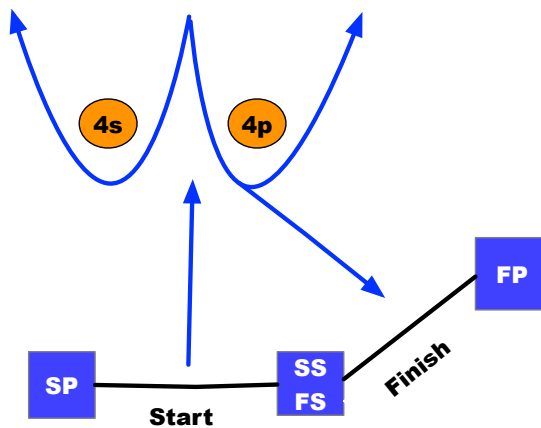
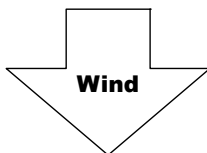
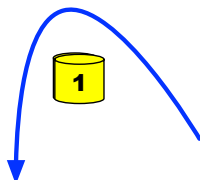
